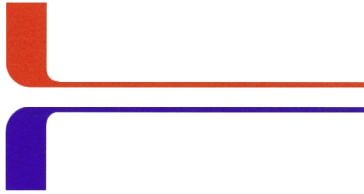

SUBJECT: 2007 National Seashore Paspalum Test
TO: Seed Companies and Breeders

Plans have been finalized for the upcoming national seashore paspalum test sponsored by the National Turfgrass Evaluation Program (NTEP). Three tests will be assembled - an *official* test to go to university personnel to be established on government-owned land only, a *commercial* test to go to commercial companies for their use only and a *consumer* test available to university personnel and others interested in the performance of commercially available entries. Companies that have at least one entry in the official test may request a set of the commercial test for evaluation as long as they are (1) members of the Turfgrass Breeders Association (TBA) and (2) allow **all** their entry(s) in the official test to be included in the commercial test. If a company does not want to evaluate the commercial test, they can elect not to have their entry(s) included in the commercial test. Please note that the NTEP will collect, summarize and disseminate data only from *official* tests. Data collected on the *commercial* and *consumer* tests will **not** be summarized and published by NTEP.

The following gives the details concerning this test. Please complete the enclosed Test Entry Application Form and Sponsorship Agreement for each entry you wish to submit. The first payment for testing is due when the seed is shipped to us. Please make checks payable to the "National Turfgrass Evaluation Program" in \$US only.

This test will be evaluated for five years at six *official (standard)* test locations across the United States, as well as being tested at two additional ancillary locations (salinity tolerance - Las Cruces, NM; cold tolerance - Fayetteville, AR). This trial will use a maintenance regime that mimics maintenance commonly found on a fairway or tee.

Plot size will be 49 sq. ft. (7' x 7' or similar size) replicated three times and the seeding rate will be 22 grams per plot (1 lb./1000 sq. ft.). Therefore, we will need the following amounts of seed:

- Inclusion in the *official* test only - **1.5** lbs. (0.68 kg) of seed of each entry
- Inclusion in both *official* and *commercial* tests - **1.75** lbs. (0.79 kg) of seed of each entry
- Inclusion in both *official* and *consumer* tests - **1.75** lbs. (0.79 kg) of seed of each entry
- Inclusion in the *official*, *commercial* and *consumer* tests - **1.75** lbs. (0.79 kg) of seed of each entry

Vegetative entries will be planted using 1.5" plugs on one-foot centers. Therefore, if sending vegetative entries, please forward *twenty* (20) one-piece plastic trays (3" x 3" cells, 18 cells per tray) of plant material for each entry. Trays can be purchased from Paradise Plastics, P. O. Drawer Y, Plant City, FL 33564, Ph. (813) 752-1155. These plants should be grown in a light planting medium, i.e. Pro-Mix, Metro-Mix, etc. This plant material should be shipped via overnight or second day air to ensure good plant survival.

The entry fee structure for this test is the following:

\$2,000.00 each entry - on or before June 1, 2008
\$2,000.00 each entry - on or before June 1, 2009
\$2,000.00 each entry - on or before June 1, 2010
\$2,000.00 each entry - on or before June 1, 2011
\$10,000.00 total

The following are guidelines for sending seed or plant material for this test:

- a. Seed or plant material must be received at Beltsville, MD by May 18, 2007.
- b. Seed or plant material received after May 18, 2007 but by May 25, 2007 can be included in this test but a **double (2x)** entry fee will be charged.
- c. Seed or plant material received after May 25, 2007 will **not** be included in this test.
- d. The entire requested amount of seed or plant material is needed for an entry to be included into this test. Entries that are received with less than the requested amount of seed will **not** be included in this test.

Therefore, we encourage good planning in preparing and shipping entries on or before the May 18th deadline. Please do not send seed treated with a pesticide. Treated seed will **not** be accepted by the NTEP. Also, please make sure seed is prepaid for shipping charges to Beltsville, MD. The NTEP will **not** pay any additional shipping fees to forward seed to Beltsville.
